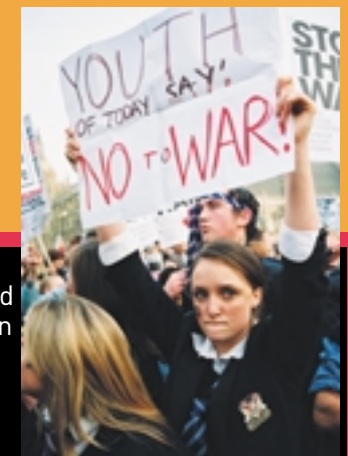

Linton Kwesi Johnson b1952, dub poet, anti-racist activist, studied Goldsmiths College.

Eleanor Marx 1855-1898, socialist and trade union activist lived Sydenham.
Ignatius Sancho c1729-1780, freed slave, writer and musician lived Blackheath.

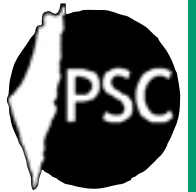
